MISSION BRIEFING

On October 18th, 1944 the *USS Mason* and two British rescue ships sailed away from the safe harbor of Bishop Rock, England and into one of the worst North Atlantic storms on record. Supply Convoy NY-119 floundered far from port in 40 knot winds that gusted up to 60 knots. The *Mason*, already damaged by the viciousness of the storm, was patched together by her crew and sailed back to sea. All three rescue ships were at risk during their mission to save fellow sailors.

The British ships turned back. The storm exceeded their courage. The waves were greater than the limits of their strength and resources. The courage and daring they held when they left the harbor weren't enough to finish the mission.

The *Mason* located the convoy and assisted their crews. Far from home and in foreign waters, the men of the *Mason* did what men close to home could not. They rescued fellow sailors from watery graves.

Soldiers of the Kingdom is written for Christian men. Men who sail out of the safe harbors of home and Church, into the violent waves and killing cold of modern society. This book is written for men who seek to rescue "fellow sailors" from graves of sin and separation from Jesus Christ.

Perhaps you were a "pew rat" who scurried around church and altar all of your life. You may have been a "street rat," living loosely in this society. Some of you were "sewer rats," deeply involved in the worst this culture has to offer. Whatever kind of rat you were, kneeling at the Cross of Christ, you became a lamb. And The Shepherd loved you.

You have grown and matured since then. You are, or are about to become, a ram. You are a valued and important

member of the flock. The Shepherd, and the rest of the flock, love you.

Predators rarely prey on Big Horn sheep. The flocks are capable of out running, or out fighting, anything that might attack them. A predator is ignorant, or stupid, to take on a Big Horn ram. Big Horn rams, who are sheep, are capable and respected fighters.

Soldiers of the Kingdom is written to Christian men. Rams of the flock of Christ. As any good ram should, we are called to lead and protect the flock: The Church established by Jesus Christ.

Your circumstances are unique and different. Your abilities are a blend of experience, training and aptitude that no one else has. No one else is like you.

God's Call has already gone out. He Calls to every man who goes by His Name. He Calls you.

Will you leave safe harbor? Will you stand for the flock?

SOLDIERS IN THE REAL WORLD

Captain White waited impatiently for the last of the transports to stop taxiing and start spitting out its contents. Bravo Company needed equipment, supplies, ammunition and men--especially men. Captain White would gladly give up every other form of support, in exchange for 150 good soldiers.

Three days ago the Crosswood airstrip, where White stood, didn't exist. Echo Company, combat engineers Bravo had escorted into the AO, had cut and finished the strip in 72 hours. Fatigued from working around the clock, the CE's didn't miss a beat in a firefight with the enemy.

White admired how the CE's held onto their half-finished project with heart and raw will. The tremendous enemy numbers didn't seem to phase the CE's. Most acted like they had fought like this before. The enemy left, the CE's stayed.

In order to hold this position Bravo Company would have to fight hard and that took resources. The highest cost would be in men.

SITUATION BRIEFING

Millions of Christian men in the United States, and around the world, have not yet exercised all of their talents or treasures for the Master. You, and your Brothers-In-Spiritual-Arms, have the calling, means and ability to influence the world for Christ. As Christian men exercise their will and determination in fulfilling the Great Commission, national and worldwide revival will inevitably result.

You, and all other Christian men, are soldiers in a titanic struggle for world domination. We serve an eternal King who seeks to save lives both now, and in eternity. We resist an enemy who seeks only to destroy everyone and everything. The battle lines are clearly drawn. Where do you stand?

Every man who has accepted Salvation through Christ Jesus is called to be a member of God's Army. Your perception of your own talent or ability is immaterial and unimportant. The King of Heaven will supply everything you need, except the will to act. Jehovah-Jireh, the Lord who Provides, gives talents and treasures to those who give themselves.

As a Christian soldier, your purpose is to stand in the path of a corrupt culture and turn it back to God. If you answer your calling to this battle, you will face tremendous opposition and belligerence, from both the natural and spiritual realms. Yet, you face the enemy with the Lord of Hosts, and a brotherhood of other Christian soldiers.

We fight an ancient enemy, who will not simply give back what he has stolen. It will have to be torn from his grasp through God's Power. His deceit and ruthlessness will mislead the very souls you liberate into resisting you. Their eyes will have to be opened by His Light and Grace. As you roll

back the darkness and repair the destruction, the culture will fight to remain dysfunctional and broken.

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised. (Luke 4:18)

Your perseverance will come from your desire to please the God of Heaven.

The immensity of the conflict, and the evil of the opposition, could lead you to think that righteousness cannot win. This is the enemy's final deception. God's Power, working through Godly men, cannot fail.

And I heard a loud voice saying in heaven, Now is come salvation, and strength, and the kingdom of our God, and the power of his Christ: for the accuser of our brethren is cast down, which accused them before our God day and night. And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death. (Revelations 12:10–11)

Who do you love more? God or yourself?

Above everything else, we must not become like our enemy. The world must see and know the difference.

Behold, I send you forth as sheep in the midst of wolves: be ye therefore wise as serpents, and harmless as doves. (Matthew 10:16)

In fact, the world will come to marvel at how Christian soldiers can overcome even physical violence and suffering through love and grace.

Winning this war is imperative. Every other concern is secondary to establishing God's Kingdom.

THE BATTLEFIELD

The place of battle is where you stand. Front office or

workshop, building site or sales counter, schoolhouse or jailhouse, you are deployed by divine purpose and heavenly intent.

And God sent me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance. So now it was not you that sent me hither, but God.
(Genesis 45:7–8)

No matter how you came to be where you are, or why you stay, you are to stand and deliver. Stand as a light of right and hope in the darkness, and deliver the Gospel of Christ to a world that desperately needs Him. God has sent you there, deliberately and with intention, to do a work for Him.

The time for battle is now.

For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation. (2 Corinthians 6:2)

Each day, the darkness encroaches on more of the world. Each day, more souls perish without knowing Him. Won't you take your place on the battle lines?

The soldier is you.

“Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.
(Joshua 1:9)

Jehovah-Shammah, the Lord who is Present, stands with His soldiers. Those who go in His Name are never alone or without His Power. Will you be the one to deliver God's Salvation?

Jesus, by His own free will, gave Himself for us. You, by your own free will, accepted Him as Savior. Now He calls you to use your will, to build His Kingdom. His Power works through willing instruments. Are you His, or your own?

HOLY WARRIORS

In order to rid their country of foreign influence and occupying troops, the *Mujaheddin* of Afghanistan challenged the full might of the Soviet Army. The *Mujaheddin*, which means “Holy Warriors” in Arabic, completely lacked air power or mechanized forces. The weapons they did have were not equal in number or power to the Soviets’. Still, the Red Army, in a humiliating retreat in 1989, left the borders of Afghanistan.

How did they achieve their victory? By bending their meager resources and ample will to one purpose. With unity and focus, they inflicted heavy casualties and tremendous losses on one of the most powerful armies of recorded history. With a common purpose, tremendous courage and unflinching sacrifice, the *Mujaheddin* wrested their nation back from a “superior” enemy.

Our nation faces a similar crisis. The question is whether there are “Holy Warriors” who will stand and fight against the spreading corruption and growing evil.

For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. (Ephesians 6:12)

Are you willing to focus yourself on God’s purposes? Will you seek out His battles against the encroaching darkness? Will you be one of His soldiers?

Numbers don’t matter. God delights in working through small numbers.

Your present situation is unimportant. The Holy Spirit’s power works best through the weak and meek.

What matters is your heart and will. Is your heart tuned to the command frequencies of Heaven? Has your will been sold to whatever purpose God might have for you? Are you willing to sacrifice the temporary for the eternal?

On the day you became Christ’s, you stopped being your own man. Repurchased from sin and death, You became His,

to use as He sees fit. Do you truly act under God's Commands, or your own? Do you follow orders from Heaven, or somewhere else?

Your free will is the key. Will you follow your own agenda or will you serve God's purpose?

But my servant Caleb, because he had another spirit with him, and hath followed me fully, him will I bring into the land whereinto he went; and his seed shall possess it.
(Numbers 14:24)

Caleb chose Jehovah-Sabaoth, the Lord of Hosts, over himself. Who do you choose?

OUR MISSION

What is our mission as Christian men? We are to conquer the world. Godly men should not rest or relax until every heart is His and every soul calls Him King. Through His Love, we call them. With His Grace, we teach them. In His Peace, we send them. Each Christian soldier recruits another soldier, who in turn becomes a warrior for Him.

THE GREAT COMMISSION

Scripture, the Great Handbook, records Jesus' mission statement for Godly men. It forms the core for all true Christianity and colors our every action. It is a sword of rare power and usefulness.

The following verses are the Great Commission:

Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen. (Matthew 28:19–20)

Note the "all nations" portion of the Great Commission. No nation or people on earth are excluded from the mission. Despite his background or experience, a Christian man is called to reach others. In some cases, a soldier may find himself ministering to the very people he once hated. Without restriction or reserve, we are to press forward, until every life is His.

Nor are we to hold back anything. “Teaching them to observe all things,” means that every Christian is capable of following every part of the Gospel. There are no hidden mysteries, or elite secrets, among Christian soldiers. There are no excuses for wrong behavior. We teach everything we know, and live everything we teach, and expect our fellow soldiers to do the same.

OUR MOTIVATION

What gives us our motivation? Why are we willing to give up our time, talent and treasure for this cause? We are moved by Love. Not the feeble affection, or crude lust, that passes for love in our society. We are powered by the deep-in-the-soul stuff that has the power to alter nations and change events.

The Great Commandment says it best:

And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment. And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these. (Mark 12:30–31)

Our love for Him exceeds all reason and every sensibility. It springs from everything we are, or hope to be. Our love for the Father compels us as nothing else can. Yet, that bottomless, untamed love has constraints.

God expects us to love others, and ourselves. If you can’t value yourself, how can you value anyone else? Then again, if you can’t express love to the living souls you see, touch and hear every day, how can you love God? Loving is more than warm wishes and kind thoughts. It requires hard-edged commitment and unflinching fortitude.

The soldiers, airmen and sailors of our armed forces are prepared to spend themselves for the nation. They have thought it through, and decided the nation is worth their lives. As a Christian soldier, are you prepared to spend yourself for the Kingdom? Is God worth your life?

OUR REWARD

What is your pay-off? What do you get out of this? Kudos? Points? Gratitude?

We are paid by God's Approval of our lives and His Joy in our hearts.

Brethren, I count not myself to have apprehended: but this one thing I do, forgetting those things which are behind, and reaching forth unto those things which are before, I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 3:13-14)

Christian soldiers can know heaven on earth, by pleasing the King of Heaven.

We work for the joy of being His.

OUR ASSIGNMENTS

There are many jobs or assignments a soldier may fulfill during a military career. Some assignments are high profile or "good duty." Some jobs are low profile or "hard duty." All soldiers' work is necessary, if the military force is going to be effective.

Christian soldiers also have assignments or jobs in building the Kingdom. Whether you think you've drawn good duty, or a hard assignment, you are serving your King and His Kingdom.

No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier. (2 Timothy 2:4)

Your first and foremost duty is to serve God and please Him.

OUR WEAPONS

We cannot go into the fray unarmed or unarmored.

For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high places. Wherefore take unto you the whole armour

of God, that ye may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. (Ephesians 6:12–13)

Evil, a real but spiritual force, is not fought with natural armaments. Darkness is defeated by God's Light and Might.

We carry God's Power and Grace. We are enabled and empowered by the Holy Spirit. We challenge the darkness of evil with the light of His Joy. Above all, we persevere in faith and are preserved by the One-who-never-fails.

BIBLE STUDY

The fastest and most reliable way to spiritual strength lies through the study of God's Word, the Bible. There are no shortcuts or speed techniques around this fundamental. You must feed on His revealed Word and absorb it deep into yourself.

For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. (Hebrews 4:12)

Learning Scripture, is the most aggressive thing a Christian soldier can do, because of the power His Word gives to your life.

MEMORIZING SCRIPTURE

Jesus memorized Scripture. Shouldn't you? He demonstrated the Word's power to overcome both devils and men. It allowed Him to free souls and heal bodies. The Bible preserved Him through trial and temptation.

With my whole heart have I sought thee: O let me not wander from thy commandments. Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee. I will delight myself in thy statutes: I will not forget thy word. (Psalms 119:10–11, 16)

David knew the secret of God's Power in his life. The man after God's own Heart memorized Scripture. Shouldn't you?

UNDERSTANDING SCRIPTURE

The effort of memorizing the Bible, straight through, would be useless without an understanding of Scripture's meaning.

Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. (2 Timothy 2:15)

Scripture is the key to understanding God and His Plan for our lives and world. The truth of the Bible must be at the core of everything we teach, every act we make, and every word we speak.

No matter what translation of the Bible you use, understanding Scripture requires hard work and disciplined diligence. We are commanded to "eat the whole roll."

And he said unto me, Son of man, cause thy belly to eat, and fill thy bowels with this roll that I give thee. Then did I eat it; and it was in my mouth as honey for sweetness. And he said unto me, Son of man, go, get thee unto the house of Israel, and speak with my words unto them. (Ezekiel 3:3-4)

By understanding Scripture, we are better able to apply its principles and laws to our lives, correctly explain God's Truth to others, and know God's Heart and Mind ourselves.

My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children. (Hosea 4:6)

His soldiers know His Word. Any Questions?

BEING SCRIPTURE

Know Scripture. Understand Scripture. Live Scripture.

Ye are our epistle written in our hearts, known and read of all men. (2 Corinthians 3:2)

The men and women you meet and change may have

never read the Gospel for themselves. Their only knowledge of Christ might come from their reading of your life.

Civilians recognize soldiers when they see them on the street. Even when they are out of uniform, soldiers demonstrate evidence of a military life in their walk, talk and actions. People can see the disciplined life a soldier leads. What evidence of a Christian life do people see in the way you walk, talk and act? What are people reading in your life?

The Christian life cannot be faked or simulated. It must be lived in spirit and in truth.

But the hour cometh, and now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in spirit and in truth: for the Father seeketh such to worship him. (John 4:23)

Real soldiers don't dwell on technicalities. Good soldiers don't hide behind the letter of the law. We operate on Commander's Intent, the ultimate purpose or mission the leader sets for the troops.

As Christian soldiers, we operate on "Commander's Intent."

Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in tables of stone, but in fleshy tables of the heart. (2 Corinthians 3:3)

The outward life you lead must reflect the inward change in your soul. The Commander, Jehovah-Sabaoth, demands that you live out His Intent.

PRAYER

Modern armies, navies and air forces spend a lot of time, effort and money on communications. Throughout history, communication has always effected the outcome of battles and entire wars. Everyone at the Pentagon, or the Kremlin, would view communication as vital.

Prayer is conversation with God. God knows the voice of His sons, whether they speak formally or casually. Gracefully intricate or bluntly straightforward, prayers are always

heard in heaven. Soldiers talk to their commander.

Behold, a man stood before me in bright clothing, And said, Cornelius, thy prayer is heard, and thine alms are had in remembrance in the sight of God. (Acts 10:30–31)

It may take a while for the answer to come, but God always answers His loyal warriors.

When have you last communicated with your Heavenly Commander?

FASTING

Fasting is voluntarily going without food or drink. Physically, it helps to purify the body. Spiritually, it helps to purify, then strengthen the soul and spirit.

That thou appear not unto men to fast, but unto thy Father which is in secret: and thy Father, which seeth in secret, shall reward thee openly. (Matthew 6:18)

Fasting builds the strength of our wills, and deepens our spiritual power.

Fasting is a signal to God that you're serious about Him and His Kingdom. Fasting and prayer allows the Holy Spirit to work and teach in your life. This spiritual discipline builds the power and toughness of the soul. God honors, and rewards, those who fast.

LOVE AND COMPASSION

If Godly men were known for only one thing, it should be for our ability to express love and compassion to others. The meanest men respond to kindness. Even hard-bitten cynics know and react to genuine compassion. The redemption message is better received with acts of benevolence and restoration.

NO PRISONERS

Allied soldiers during World War II came across multiple prison or concentration camps on their way to victory. In every case, the soldiers stopped their advance and helped those who were held captive. Often brutally mistreated and

cruelly diseased, the former prisoners were grateful for their freedom from imprisonment. Giving liberty to the captive was a part of the Allies' victory.

The Christian soldier is always ready to set free those captured by sin.

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised. (Luke 4:18)

Many of those imprisoned by sin are brutally mistreated and cruelly diseased, yet they deserve to know the Master's Grace. Giving liberty to sinners is part of Christ's victory.

SIN AND SINNERS

Make no mistake. Christian men hate sin. Sin first offends our God, then us. We stand against sin whenever and wherever we can.

Make no mistake. Christian men love sinners. Sinners are first God's Children, and then our brothers and sisters. We stand for sinners whenever and wherever we can.

Christ himself models the "take no prisoners" mentality of Godly men.

When Jesus had lifted up himself, and saw none but the woman, he said unto her, Woman, where are those thine accusers? hath no man condemned thee? She said, No man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more. (John 8:10-11)

Under the law, she deserved nothing but death, but Jesus' grace set her free. Shouldn't we do what our Master does?

Jesus is not interested in taking prisoners. Christ, in Compassion and Grace, yearns to let rank sinners go free from the prison of sin. God is a God of liberty and freedom. Who have you set free lately?

THE OUTCOME

Hardship and sacrifice are a warrior's lot. Soldiers face unpleasant conditions, even on modern battlefields.

Infantrymen struggle through mud or dust, snow or sand, simply to arrive at the war zone. Pilots spend long hours in cramped cockpits, only to endure brutal physical stresses during combat maneuvers. Sailors fight the complex machines called modern warships, and the incredible power of God's oceans, only to face enemy vessels. All of them sleep, when they can, in whatever position they are in, for the scant minutes they have.

Warriors face adversity, then the enemy.

Godly soldiers are no different. We deny ourselves many of the pleasures of this world, because they damage our characters or distract us from God's purposes. We surrender our time and treasures to His causes, then teach our families to do the same. We wrestle first with our own sinful natures, then with the enemy's sinister assaults. Finally, our rest is in eternity, not this temporal world.

Yet, we march along, singing with joy and sincerity.

Yea doubtless, and I count all things but loss for the excellency of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord: for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and do count them but dung, that I may win Christ. (Philippians 3:8)

We are fighting for an eternal victory, through Christ. Time is on our side.

We feel the pain. We suffer the privations. We endure the hardship. Yet, we march on; knowing victory will be ours. Knowing the outcome of our faithfulness, we press forward. We know the Lord of Hosts, and are soldiers of the King of Heaven. Godly men know these short-term inconveniences will be over matched by our long-term rewards.

VICTORY

Soldiers always want to know victory. Especially when

the sacrifices of battle have been great.

For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments: and his commandments are not grievous.
